

Dear member of Congress:

As your constituent, I write to you today to thank you for supporting Taiwan, and to bring an issue to your attention of great importance to me and to Taiwanese Americans in general.

The “U.S. One China policy,” as derived from the US-China 1972 Shanghai Communique, holds that the U.S. acknowledges the Chinese position that Taiwan is part of China. Of course it is incontestable reality that Taiwan is NOT part of China.

The policy is an old Cold War relic and hurts today’s democratic Taiwan. I believe it needs to be replaced by a “One China, One Taiwan policy.”

Also, the U.S. currently maintains full diplomatic relations with all the countries in the world except for five: Syria, North Korea, Iran, Bhutan, and Taiwan. Taiwan, a vibrant and open society and one of the most important trading economies in the world, does not belong in that small group of isolated nations.

On June 19, 2018, Rep. Dana Rohrabacher introduced HCR124. It calls for replacing the “U.S. One China policy” with a more realistic “One China, One Taiwan policy.”

HCR124 also calls for the reestablishment of U.S. diplomatic relations with Taiwan, and for U.S. support for Taiwan's full participation in the United Nations and all other international organizations.
